

NEW STATION BENEFITS

Continued excellence in your Fire Department. Modern buildings support your community's center for emergency education, preparedness, prevention, and response.

Reduced reaction times. Designs focus on efficient circulation and up-to-date technology that supports vehicle-specific paging by room and station doors that open faster.

Room for growth. As Bothell continues to grow and service needs increase, the Fire Department will have ample space for additional personnel, on-site training and parking.

Firefighter health and safety upgrades. The new layout of both stations will integrate operations and design best practices to reduce the spread of harmful carcinogens and contaminants from work areas to firefighter living spaces.

Built to last. Quality design and construction will ensure ongoing ease of facility maintenance to meet Bothell's long-term emergency response needs.



Aligns to the industry standard. Station 45 in Canyon Park will upgrade to include separate sleeping quarters for Bothell's female firefighters.

Safeguards our investments. New stations will include proper storage and care for our fleet of fire vehicles and equipment. Both buildings will meet current requirements for earthquake codes, sprinklers, and alarms.
