COUNCIL CORNER

2017 is looking good

Looking back on the year, we've been through a lot together. Last summer's devastating Main Street fire temporarily knocked out dozens of small businesses, destroyed the Bothell Mall, and severely damaged the Mercantile Building. Wind carried embers blocks away, but our stellar Bothell Fire Department, aided by nearby fire departments and the Bothell Police and Public Works departments, put out the fire and kept it from spreading further.

Our community came together after the fire. With leadership from the Greater Bothell Chamber of Commerce and the Northshore Rotary, people rallied. They flocked to a block party to thank first responders and to raise funds for fire victims. The Bothell Fire Fund eventually raised more than \$100,000. Meanwhile, the City's Bothell Assistance and Recovery Team provided resources for affected businesses. While the recovery is ongoing, Main Street is open for business.

We've got lots going for us. The City is making significant progress on downtown revitalization. The Horse Creek Improvements project wrapped up this fall, completing not just a stormwater project but enhancing Bothell's walkability. The City plans to accelerate the Main Street Enhancement Project, beginning in 2017. Environmental investigation is underway in preparation for cleanup on the property along the future extension of Main Street, west of Bothell Way. The Multiway Boulevard is scheduled for completion in summer 2017.

The City is also working to preserve parks and open space. Forterra is temporarily holding the Wayne Golf Course while the City works on a master plan and funding strategy to buy the property. 1st Lt. Nicholas Madrazo will be under construction soon; the East Norway Hill Master Plan is scheduled for completion in 2017.

At the same time, private development is bringing more housing and amenities. The Junction is rising just south of McMenamins. Two hotels are slated to begin construction on the City Hall block in 2017. The University of Washington Bothell and Cascadia College are working on a master plan to enhance academic and housing facilities in our college town.

It's a time to count our blessings. I wish you a safe and happy holiday season.

Bothell Police Officer honored



Bothell Police Officer Erik Martin received the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Award this fall. The mother of a child who is autistic nominated Officer Martin. She highlighted the personal steps Officer Martin has taken to help her son.

Officers from around the state were nominated for this award for their work dealing with persons who are in mental or emotional crisis. Most officers in the state have attended a 40 hour training on how to approach, work with, and resolve incidents involving people who are experiencing crisis.

Officer Martin also leads the Bothell Police Department's efforts to help the homeless. He works with Public Works, Parks and Recreation, and other regional partners to ensure the homeless population in our city receive assistance.

North Creek Forest update

The Bothell City Council has authorized the City Manager to sign a purchase and sale agreement with the Fries Family LLC to buy an 8.23 acre parcel of the North Creek Forest for \$1,250,000. Once finalized, the purchase will complete the acquisition of all 63.4 acres of the forest, preserving the land from development.

Community groups have been working for many years to acquire all the property that is known as the North Creek Forest. A grassroots organization, Help Our Woods, started the efforts in the year 2000 and raised funds to purchase initial parcels of the forest. The City of Bothell and Friends of North Creek Forest have been working jointly for a number of years to raise funds to buy the remainder.



POLLUTED STORMWATER RUNOFF: What is it and what can you do about it?

When rain falls or snow melts in Bothell, where do you think the water goes? Does it soak into the ground? Does it sit in a puddle until it disappears? If you answered “yes” then you are partially correct – some water soaks into the ground or evaporates into the air.

But what happens to the rest of the rainwater? Most of it flows over hard surfaces (like roofs, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, roads, etc.) and into the nearest storm drain, stream, or ditch without prior treatment. This water is called “runoff” or, sometimes, “stormwater runoff.”

As this water flows over our hard surfaces, it picks up harmful pollutants that we have left behind. Sometimes the pollution is something you can see like trash, oil, soap and dirt. Other pollution you can't see includes chemicals, bacteria, pesticides, and fertilizers.


Because this pollution is caused by each one of us, we all can make a difference. Simple steps like

- picking up your pet waste
- checking your vehicle for leaks, and
- not applying chemicals to your lawn really do make a difference.
