


Bruce Kroon selected as new Fire Chief

HELP PREVENT LOCALIZED FLOODING


Many residents mistakenly blow or sweep their fallen leaves into the street, not realizing they become a safety and stormwater hazard to their property and neighborhood. The storm drains in your street capture, move, and release rain water into the nearest stream to keep excess water away from your property. If leaves clog these drains, it can cause localized flooding.

There are more than 302 lane miles of public roads we maintain with over 8,400 storm drains in the City, so crews can't clear all of the drains before and during storms. Clogged storm drains can leave your neighborhood at risk.

How can you help?

- Rake leaves into your yard waste bin.
- Use leaves as mulch on garden beds and landscaped areas.
- Join the Adopt-A-Drain program and pledge to remove leaves from at least four storm drains in your area. Extra yard waste bags are available through the program by contacting Janet Geer at janet.geer@bothellwa.gov or 425-806-6796.

Safe Streets & Sidewalks

Putting your levy dollars to work



The Public Works Department has been busy gearing up and staffing up to improve streets and sidewalks since voters approved the Safe Streets & Sidewalks Levy. The levy funded the following:

Street Operations *\$1.95 million per year*

Crews continue to address critical ongoing maintenance needs such as pothole repairs, asphalt patching, sidewalk repair, sign and pavement markings, and emergency response activities. The levy funded a reinstatement of the sidewalk repair/replacement and asphalt patching programs, now well underway.

The Operations portion of the levy also included funding for more robust pavement markings, which crews are implementing over the next quarter.

Pavement Preservation *\$1.65 million per year*

A robust Pavement Preservation program began this year including contracts awarded for:

- Overlay (pave) 102nd Ave NE between the bridge and East Riverside Drive
- Overlay a portion of 100th Ave NE and 19th Ave SE
- Overlay a short section of Juanita-Woodinville Way that has completely failed
- Seal approximately 72,000 linear feet of cracks on various arterials throughout the City.

City staff are currently assessing local streets for suitability of a slurry seal. The goal is to prepare identified streets over the next year for sealing next summer. Funds available for local streets are 10% of the available budget for Pavement Preservation.

Safe School Walk Routes *\$400,000 per year*

Staff inventoried and prioritized missing crosswalks, sidewalk segments, and curb ramps. Major activities associated with the levy-funded Safe School Walk Route (SSWR) program are:

- Completed design of the 234th St SE walkway project (east of Meridian to Shelton View Elementary School).
- Facilitated eight Safe School Walk Routes Taskforce meetings among PTSA and Northshore School District representatives. The group met to discuss pedestrian needs around schools. See www.bothellwa.gov/SSWR for details.
- Kicked off Bothell's Safe Schools Pedestrian Flag Program in partnership with the Northshore School District. The City has added pedestrian flags on school walk routes, making it easier for drivers to identify pedestrians. See the locations at www.bothellwa.gov/crossingflags.



Additionally, the City was awarded grants for three sidewalk projects totaling \$2.03 million under the State of Washington's Safe Routes to Schools program. The projects will directly benefit pedestrian access to and around schools.

- 19th Ave SE/232nd St SE/23rd Ave SE: \$748,800
Currently under design and should be ready to begin construction in 2018
- 7th Ave SE/88th Ave NE: \$610,200
Ready to begin design in early 2018
- NE 188th St: \$672,000
Ready to begin design in early 2018

Flashing beacons added near schools

Over the summer, the City added flashing beacons at five locations in north Bothell to enhance safety:



- 4th Ave W. at 218th St SW (near Frank Love Elementary School)
- 4th Ave W. at 220th St SW (near Frank Love Elementary School)
- 9th Ave SE just south of 216th St SE mid-block (near Crystal Springs Elementary School)
- 35th Ave SE at 214th Pl SE (near Skyview Junior High and Canyon Creek Elementary schools)
- 23th Ave SE at 236th St SE (near Canyon Park Junior High School)

Pedestrians can push a button to activate the Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacons (RRFB). The beacons supplement warning signs at intersections without signals and at mid-block crosswalks. The beacons use an irregular flash pattern similar to emergency flashers on police vehicles. RRFBs cost less than traffic signals and are shown to increase the number of drivers who yield to pedestrians at crosswalks, improving pedestrian safety and reducing accidents.

Curb the Congestion is a program to reduce traffic and encourage healthy travel options on congested roadways. Curb the congestion is funded in partnership with Snohomish County through developer mitigation and federal grants.

EMS LEVY ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT

Voters in the Snohomish County area of the Bothell city limits will see a Bothell Urban Emergency Medical Service Levy on their general election ballots this November. The current six-year levy expires on January 1, 2018. A new six-year levy would continue to provide both Basic Life Support and Advanced Life Support to the Snohomish County area within the City through 2023.

Property owners within the King County portion of the City are paying \$0.335 per thousand Assessed Value (AV) and those within the City's Snohomish County area are paying \$0.30 per thousand AV. Council approved a Snohomish County levy rate of up to \$0.335 per thousand AV for 2018 - 2023 to match what King County residents currently pay. The current King County E.M.S. (KCEMS) six-year levy will expire on December 31, 2019, so the Snohomish County portion of the levy is two years ahead of King County. King County's rate for the next six year period has not yet been set, but KCEMS anticipates it will not increase beyond \$0.35 per thousand AV in the next levy.

Estimated revenue in 2018 is \$1,212,858 based on current assessed valuation per thousand at the \$0.335 levy rate. The revenue would help to keep pace with ongoing increases in expenses. It will not provide an increased service level.

Council approves Wayne/Sammamish Regional Park



The City Council this summer gave City Manager Jennifer Phillips approval to initiate the acquisition of the Wayne/Sammamish Regional Park. The estimated cost to acquire the property from Forterra, a land conservation organization currently holding the land, is about \$10.9 million. Staff will return to Council with a full funding acquisition plan. The City has obtained about \$5.3 million in grant funding and has additional requests totaling \$2 million awaiting approval. If the remaining requests are approved, the unfunded cost would be about \$3.6 million.

Forterra purchased the Wayne Golf Course Back Nine in February of 2016 and closed on the acquisition of the Front Nine in May 2016. Forterra agreed to hold the property for three years to provide the City and our regional partners' time to identify funding to purchase the property for a regional park.

New Walking Guide coming soon

The Community Walking Guide will include 14 suggested walking routes to explore Bothell and get some exercise. A printed and online version of the walking guide will be available.
