## Bothell well-poised for the future

December is a time to look back on the year and take stock, as well as look forward to the year ahead. The last year brought significant change to the City of Bothell which positions us well to tackle upcoming challenges and capitalize on opportunities.

We started 2017 by hiring a new City Manager, Jennifer Phillips. She brings new energy and dynamic leadership to the City, as well as a well-rounded approach to overall City management.

This year we've also made significant strides toward some pretty audacious goals. Some highlights:

**Safe Streets & Sidewalks** – Already we're seeing improvements along school walk routes and roadways, funded by the levy voters approved in November 2016. The nine-year levy helps us improve school zone safety, funds road maintenance, improves the life of our roads, and creates sidewalk connections. (See page 20.)

**Downtown Revitalization** – We know it's been a challenge during construction, but with the Multiway Boulevard and Main Street Enhancement the City is making great progress to revitalize downtown.

**Canyon Park Master Planning** – This year we initiated a planning process for the future of Canyon Park (see page 15)

and have worked hard to secure regional funding to address traffic issues on I-405 and SR 527.

**Wayne Golf Course Acquisition** – The City is working with King County to purchase the 89-acre property from Forterra by the end of this year.



**Open Space** – This year we acquired the North Creek Forest, as well as took steps toward securing additional parklands in the Snohomish County portion of the City.

This January, we will have several new members on the City Council. I am really looking forward to working with

all the Councilmembers. It will be a new chapter for the City Council with new perspectives and vision. Together we will revisit/update the Council goals, setting the City's future course.

With your involvement and strong City leadership, I'm confident that Bothell is well-poised for the future. Have a safe and happy holiday season and best wishes for the New Year.

## City seeks public input on 2018 Public Safety Levy

The City of Bothell is considering a public safety ballot measure that would appear on general election ballots in November 2018.

Until recently, citizen surveys have shown that Bothell residents felt safe and were satisfied with the level of public safety services provided by the City. Many factors have created an unprecedented demand on police, court and fire services.

Like most communities, calls to 9-1-1 in Bothell and subsequent case filings have rapidly become much more time intensive and technically complex. The opioid epidemic, recent court rulings about search warrants, and other factors have contributed to workloads. Staffing is no longer adequate to maintain the community's public safety service standards. In addition, the Fire & EMS Department has significant infrastructure and equipment needs; a strategic plan is underway that will identify specific needs.

In 2001, Washington voters approved I-747 to increase accountability and transparency in government spending. I-747 limits increases in property tax to 1 percent over the dollar amount levied in the prior year – unless through a ballot measure, voters approve a Levy Lid Lift.

We need your thoughts as we determine the level and cost of public safety services for a November 2018 Public Safety Maintenance and Operating Levy Lid Lift. Watch for additional information and opportunities on the City website and social media.



## What do you think about Canyon Park?

The City of Bothell wants your help to develop a new vision for the Canyon Park Regional Growth Center (RGC). The future growth of the Canyon Park area is critical to both the City of Bothell and the region as a whole. In 2018, the City will develop Comprehensive Plan policies and implement regulations to achieve the identified vision.



### About Canyon Park

Canyon Park serves as a major employment and commercial hub for the City of Bothell and the Puget Sound region. It hosts a diverse mix of office, light industrial, research and development, retail, and residential uses. It is also part of the Bio-Medical Device Innovation Zone, an area with a high concentration of medical device manufacturers.

### Objectives of the visioning effort

- Attract more businesses, retain existing businesses, and expand job growth opportunities;
- Accommodate the City's assigned population and employment growth targets;
- Ensure that the Canyon Park RGC complements rather than competes with downtown.



# POLLUTED STORMWATER RUNOFF


## What is it and what can you do about it?

When rain falls or snow melts in Bothell, where do you think the water goes? Does it soak into the ground? Does it sit in a puddle until it disappears? If you answered “yes,” you are partially correct; some water soaks into the ground or evaporates into the air.

But what happens to the rest of the rainwater? Most of it flows over hard surfaces (like roofs, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, roads, etc.) and into the nearest storm drain, stream, or ditch without prior treatment. This water is called “runoff” or “stormwater runoff.”

As this water flows over our hard surfaces, it picks up harmful pollutants that we left behind. Sometimes the pollution is something you can see like trash, oil, soap and dirt. Other times you can't see the pollution, when chemicals, bacteria, pesticides and fertilizers are washed into a nearby creek.

Because this pollution is caused by each one of us, we can make a difference. Simple steps like picking up your pet waste, checking your vehicle for leaks, and not applying chemicals to your lawn really do make a difference.


