Voters will decide Bothell's public safety future when they vote on two public safety ballot measures this November.



Proposition 1:

PUBLIC SAFETY LEVY LID LIFT

Tackling Today's and Tomorrow's Challenges

Funds staffing, operating and program needs, including 27 additional police officers, firefighters and civilian staff and 9 support vehicles

INVESTMENT

Approximately \$220/year on \$500,000 home
(44 cents/\$1,000 AV; expires in 12 years)

Proposition 2:

PUBLIC SAFETY CAPITAL BOND

Rebuilding and Modernizing Aging Fire Stations

Funds the complete rebuild of two fire stations (Canyon Park and Downtown) including safety upgrades, technical modernization and energy efficiency to accommodate current and future growth

INVESTMENT

Approximately \$130/year on \$500,000 home
(26 cents/\$1,000 AV; 20 year bond)

EMERGENCY RESPONSE:

Additional firefighters, response vehicles and new technology for rapid, reliable response

ENFORCEMENT:

More police officers for increased patrol operations, traffic enforcement and pedestrian safety

ENGAGEMENT:

Additional police officers for augmented school and community presence, outreach and engagement, including online

EMERGING CHALLENGES:

Expanded police officers and civilian staff to target drug use, mental illness, homelessness, property crime and school safety issues
