



2nd Quarter 2019 Update

Investing in your streets and sidewalks

Passage of the Safe Streets & Sidewalks Levy in November 2016 brings over \$4 million in annual funding for the City’s transportation network for nine years. The priorities for funding are to:

- Improve the condition of major streets
- Construct sidewalks and crosswalks around schools
- Patch asphalt and repair and replace sidewalks
- Fully fund the Street Operations Division
- Improve pavement markings

Second Quarter 2019 Status Update

Street Operations

Street Operations continued sidewalk repair and replacement in safe route to school zones, asphalt patching and pothole repairs throughout the city, and critical ongoing maintenance programs focused on public safety. Some residual maintenance activities in the aftermath of the February snowstorm continued early into the second quarter such as pothole repair, tree trimming and right-of-way debris clean-up.

Crews replaced and repaired damaged sidewalk panels in Shelton View, Westhill and Northwood neighborhoods. These areas serve Shelton View Elementary School, Canyon Park Junior High and Westhill Elementary School. Street crews also focused on mowing right-of-ways, addressing sight distance problems at busy intersections around the city, and maintaining landscaped areas around the downtown area.

Crews are continuing sign maintenance including washing and replacing as necessary. Warmer weather towards the end of the quarter allowed staff to mark pavement and replace damaged curbs. The table below shows the significant progress in 2019 thru the second quarter.

Pavement Preservation

The Pavement Preservation Program completed design of the Woodinville Drive Arterial Overlay from I-405 to eastern city limits during the second quarter.

Safe School Walk Routes

The Safe School Walk Routes Program accomplishments in the second quarter of 2019 were:

- [NE 188th St Non-Motorized Project](#) – Design is complete.
- [7th Ave SE/88th Ave NE Non-Motorized Improvements Project](#)- Design is 100% complete. Construction contract to be advertised in August 2019
- [2019 Americans with Disabilities Act \(ADA\) Curb Ramp Project](#) – The plans, specifications and estimate were advertised for construction with bids opened on February 28. Council awarded the construction contract on April 2. Construction of 27 new curb ramps began in April 2019 and was considerably complete by the end of June.
- [19th Ave SE, 232nd St SE, and 23rd Ave Non-Motorized](#) – Council awarded the construction contract on April 9. Construction began in May and crews focused on moving utilities underground along 19th Ave SE for much of the second quarter.

Communications


The 2018 Annual Report was published in the June issue of the *Bridge* and on the City website. In addition, the communications team sent out an electronic newsletter to the community.

The team posted information highlighting multiple projects in neighborhoods near three schools on social media on May 22.

This quarter the City worked to offer information on its projects in various languages and formats. Staff worked closely with the Northshore School District to gather data on the top languages spoken across the City and instituted “iSpeak” cards for front desk staff at City Hall to use with walk-in visitors. These efforts are part of the City’s initiative around inclusion and diversity.
